

## SLP Launches Joint On Call System

Effective Thursday evening, July 7, St. Louis PARTNERS (SLP) is launching our emergency Joint On Call System. This is an emergency line that will be available to all resource parents after hours and on holidays!

We know it can be scary when you have an emergency situation, need support, don't know what to do or who to call. St. Louis PARTNERS (SLP) is here to support you!

This "on call" number 314-607-9705 will be staffed after our partner agencies' business hours, from 5:30 p.m. to 8:30 a.m. It is available to all our partner agencies' providers! If you have an emergency after business hours, just call this number.

A few examples where this number can help you is if there is an emergency illness, injury or crisis situation with a child placed in your care. For some families, this number will replace an individual agency number, and for other



families, this may be a number that you already have. Either way, this is now "the" number for everyone to call to make sure we can support you all in the best way possible!

Please program this emergency on call number 314-607-9705 into your phone now so you have it when/if you need it.

Know that you are never alone, and we are here for you!

## Sup's Corner: Helping kids adjust

I think we can all agree that there are so many overwhelming obstacles that our kids are facing in today's world. If I'm being honest, sometimes it's hard for us as adults to keep track of everything. Due to this, helping a child adjust into a new environment can be challenging, and you may see some difficult behaviors.

If you find yourself in this situation, here are just a few tips to help them feel safe while they are adjusting to their new environment.

1. Make Them Feel
Welcome: Something as simple as giving them a tour of the home to get a feel for the physical environment. Invite them to engage in family activities and encourage them to share activities they enjoy that you can participate in with them.

- 2. Create a schedule / routine: Having a consistent routine will provide a sense of safety when a child knows what to expect. The uncertainty of not knowing can be overwhelming.
- **3. Call on your community:** Utilize your
  natural supports and the
  supports of other foster
  parents. Engaging in a
  foster parent support
  group can be beneficial
  when sharing with others
  who know what you are
  going through. Some of
  the best advice I've
  received has been from
  foster parents I've
  worked with.
- 4. Be patient with yourself and with them: Knowing that our children have likely experienced trauma and have been removed from the family and homes they are familiar with can cause stress

for them, as well as you. Show compassion and open yourself to new learning experiences.

If you find yourself in a situation with some challenging behaviors and would like some additional training on managing potential crisis, please reach out to your licensing worker about additional trainings. **Bringing Families** Together offers a **Safe Crisis Management training** that covers several parenting tools that can be of assistance.
